6th grade teachers share what life on a “team “ is like...

What are the team expectations of a middle school student?

One of the biggest changes that middle-schoolers must adapt to is the idea of “teams.” Here at Indian Crest, we take the word “team” very seriously. Each student is expected to support his/her team members in both academic and social settings, and cooperate like a true team member. Students are expected to be respectful of their peers at all times, supporting one another to help everyone succeed. After all, a cooperative team environment will ensure that students can participate in a variety of fun activities Crest has to offer. In past years, for example, sixth grade students enjoyed a friendly Whiffle ball competition, field trips, activity nights, C3, some afterschool clubs, and spirit assemblies. We are also looking forward to a picnic for the whole grade! Many of these activities also allow all sixth grade students to interact and have fun, with students from all 5 teams.

Sixth grade students will also tell you that with a new school comes new responsibility. All students will be loaned a computer for the year; it is the expectation that these devices are treated and used appropriately. Unlike elementary school, students are expected to carry their materials from class to class. In order to be successful and prepared, team teachers encourage students to create a system for organization, including one or more binders. It is the students’ responsibility to arrive to class on time with all needed materials, including but not limited to, notebooks, Chromebooks, and pencils. It may take a few days, but every student will find their own system to fit their own organizational needs.

Although there are some considerable differences to adjust to, the first (and probably scariest) hurdle will be the first days of school. During these first days, all team teachers will be helping students with lockers, understanding schedules, and finding their way around the building. Also available to assist will be members of WEB, a group of Indian Crest 8th grade students who will be ready to help at almost every corner. To make these first days run smoothly, current sixth grade students recommend one thing above all else: **DON'T PANIC!** Instead, practice those lockers at every opportunity, double check the schedule, and if a question comes up, just ask!

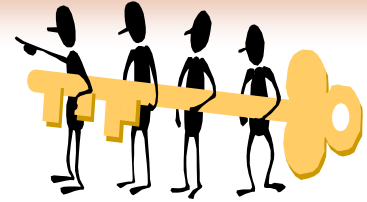

Frequently Asked Questions

As your fifth grade year comes to an end, we are sure many questions are popping up as to what life will be like in middle school. Here are some of the most frequently asked questions of sixth grade teachers:

Do we have homework?

Yes. You will have homework. The amount of homework assigned will vary by subject. Expect to have some homework every night.

What time is this class over?

Core classes are 65 minutes long and related arts are 41. Of course, it will not feel that long since you will be having a blast in class!

Are we doing anything fun today?

Of course! Your sixth grade teachers work hard to develop fun and interesting lessons.

Do we get laptops and can we take them home?

Yes, all students are issued Chrome-books or laptops in the beginning of the year, and you can bring them home every night. Remember to take care of them and charge them!

Can I borrow a pencil?

You are expected to bring a pencil to class. If you do not have one, some teachers may let you borrow one during class as long as it gets returned. However, it is best to be prepared!

Are the tests hard?

You will receive study guides for tests. If you do your homework each night, take time to study each night, and pay attention in class you will do fine on the test.

Can I go to my locker?

Teams will schedule locker stops throughout the day. During the locker stops, you are expected to gather the materials you will need until the next scheduled stop.

Can we change seats?

Most likely, the seat you start out in on the first day of school will be different from the seat you are in at the end of the year. We know that you want to sit next to your friends, but we encourage you to mingle and get to know your teammates.

Why are we learning about this?

The sixth grade curriculum picks up where your fifth grade teachers left off. We look forward to the opportunity to continue to develop the skills that will help you succeed in school and life.
